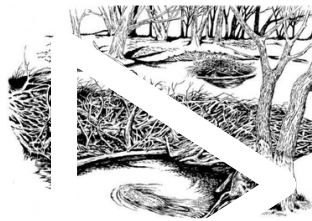

What do you know about beavers? They are very interesting, smart, intelligent mammals.

Beavers (*Castor Canadensis*) are large rodents with thick fur and big, flat tails. There are two species of beavers and they live throughout the forests of North America, Europe and Asia. However, beavers can now be found in the southern cone of South America, in Patagonia as an invasive species threatening the forests there.

Beavers can stay underwater for up to 15 minutes without surfacing. They use their tails to warn their family when there is danger.

Beaver fur is highly valued beautiful fur. Trappers trap beavers during the winter months. Beavers have many predators like fox, lynx, bears, wolves and humans.

Beavers are very busy! It can gnaw through a tree trunk and fell a large tree in 5 days.

Beavers are "builders", building dams packed with mud from the pond. They use sticks, logs and stones to build their dam. A pond behind their dam gives the beaver a safe home and a food source.

Beavers live on the pond bank where they sleep and rest. They have a lot of fat on their bodies which helps them survive in winter.

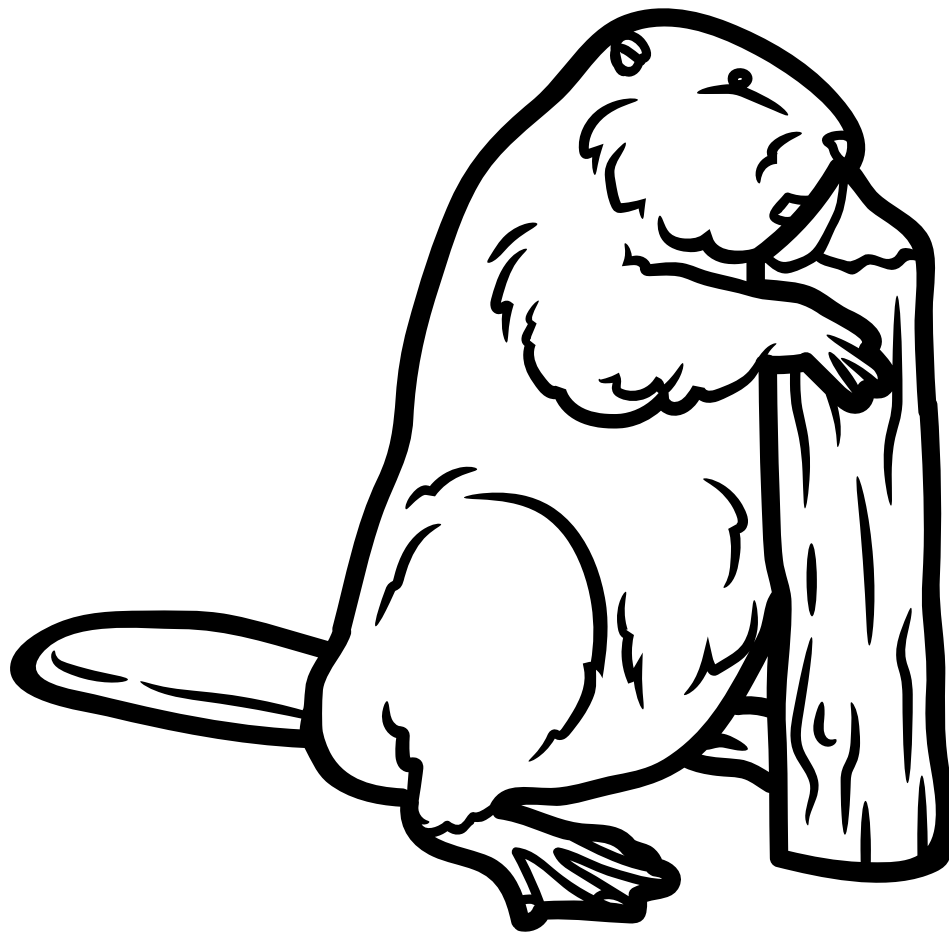

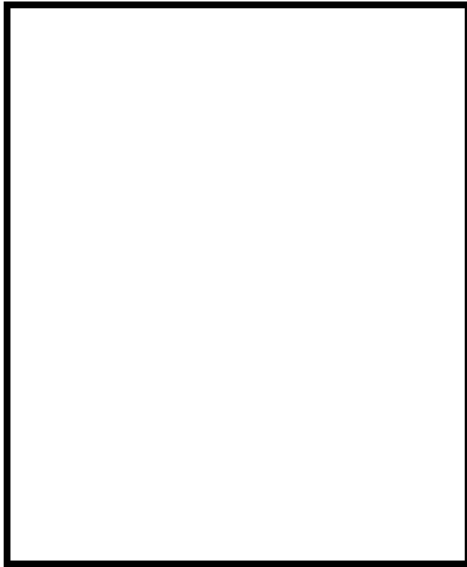
