

12 ANIMAL FACTS

Fact #1: Elephants Never Forget

"Did you know that elephants have incredible memories? Their brain, especially the part responsible for memory, is highly developed. This helps them recognize friends and family even after years apart!"

Fact #2: Frogs Can Freeze and Still Live!

"Some frogs, like the wood frog, have an amazing ability to freeze during the winter and thaw out alive in the spring. They don't even need to breathe while frozen—how cool is that?"

Fact #3: Octopuses Have Three Hearts

"Yes, you heard that right! Octopuses have not one, not two, but three hearts. Two pump blood to the gills, and one pumps it to the rest of the body. They truly wear their hearts... everywhere!"

Fact #4: Penguins Propose with Pebbles

"When a male penguin falls in love, he presents the female with a pebble as a proposal gift. If she accepts, they become a lifelong couple. Who knew pebbles could be so romantic?"

Fact #5: Cheetahs Don't Roar, They Purr

"While big cats like lions roar to communicate, cheetahs do something completely different—they purr just like house cats when they're content! They also chirp to get attention."

Fact #6: Sharks Have Been Around Longer Than Trees

"Sharks are ancient creatures! They've been swimming in the oceans for over 400 million years, which means they've been around longer than trees. Talk about survivors of evolution!"

Fact #7: Sloths Only Poop Once a Week

"Sloths are famously slow, and even their bathroom breaks are lazy. They only come down from trees to poop once a week. It's quite an event for them!"

Fact #8: Butterflies Taste with Their Feet
