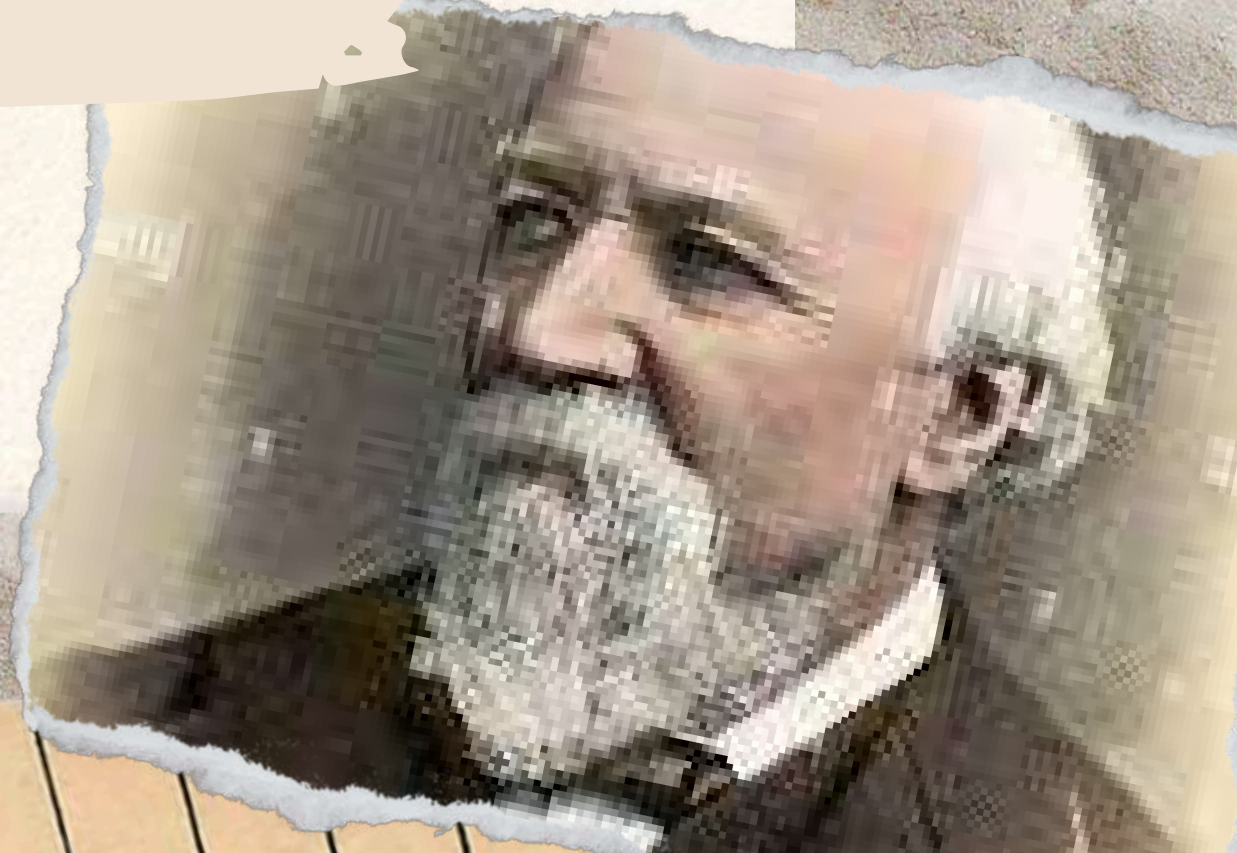

POET'S BACKGROUND

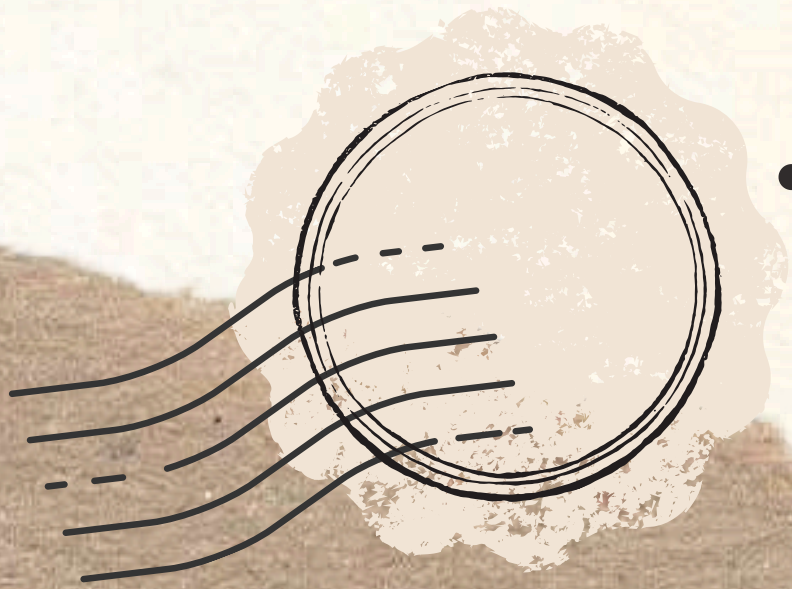
- He was an English poet and playwright.

IDEAS ABOUT THE POEM



CONTEXT
